AGM Speech

I would like to thank all those members who provided the support in voting for me to be the President of the Central Cumberland Federation. I will ensure that Federation is prepared for the future changes in our sport.

With the current age demographic of our members, I would expect in less than 10 years that we will have around 150 competing members. Expecting that pigeon racing will be more professional with possibly live tracking of our birds racing home.

Due to affordability, you would expect that race team sizes will reduce. From the above changes serious consideration should be made to reducing our transportation assets.

Not wanting to be a bearer of bad news I must make you aware that there is a strong chance that we will not be able to complete this years racing due to the Avian Flu H5N1 strain expected to reach Australia. Currently H5N1 is in the Antarctica and killed tens of thousands of penguins and seals that prey on sick penguins. Authorities believe that it is only a matter of time before this virus reaches Australian shores. In the USA last year over 126 million chickens were euthanized. Also infecting 19 dairy farms and one human.

Other challenges include a changing magnetic field. The magnetic North Pole has already shifted over 1200km towards Siberia Russia over only 6 year period. Challenging magnetic field strengths and potential flip of the earth's core could challenge our bird's ability to find home.

On a brighter note, I can let you know that I have been involved with several work committees on the off season to bring the CCF towards being the leading fed in Australia.
